Over the last twenty years, feminist researchers have argued that analyzing gender is essential to understanding security, political economy, foreign policy, and other dimensions of global politics.

The books in this series ask where women are and where gender is in the events, interactions, and structures of global politics. Individually, they show that studying gender adds theoretical and explanatory richness to theorizing. Collectively, they demonstrate that feminist work constitutes a paradigmatic research program that scholars, students, and practitioners of global politics should engage.

Rather than just looking at gender as something specific to “women’s issues” in global politics, this series combines theoretical and empirical analyses to challenge *all* International Relations (IR) scholars to take account of gender *across the subject matters* in global politics and challenge policy-makers to make better policy by noticing the gender-differential impacts of supposedly “neutral” policies.

This series will provide an important, high-profile publishing outlet for a range of talented authors, both established and up-and-coming.
